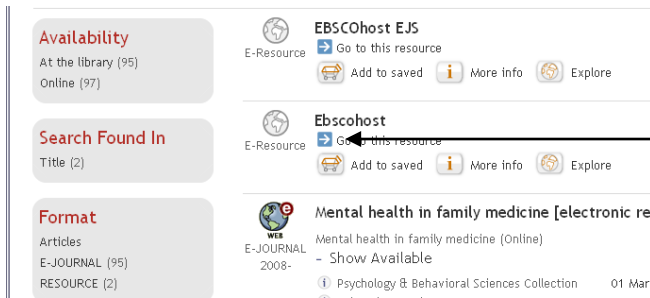

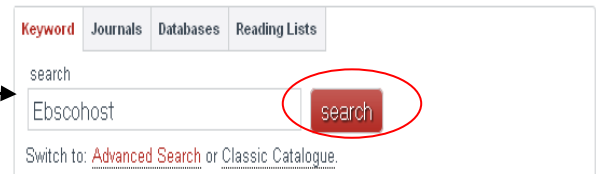
Type **Ebscohost** into the search box and click on 'search'.



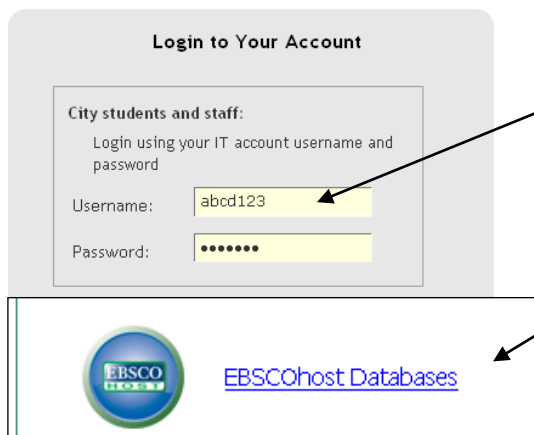

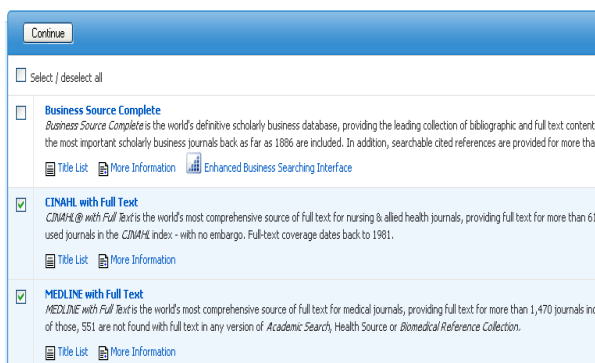
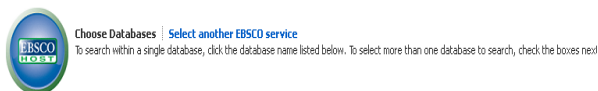

1. Enter your search terms, keeping each separate concept in a separate box. Click the drop down arrow next to select a field and choose **Abstract** – this ensures only more relevant articles are retrieved.
2. You can **Limit** results by publication date, age, gender, full text and peer-reviewed articles only.
3. Click the **Search** button. The Result List displays.



1. **All Results** – The articles that were found display in the center of the Result List Screen.
2. The **article title** link takes you to the abstract, with search terms in bold text.
3. The **PDF Full Text** link takes you to a PDF version of the full text.
4. Where there is no PDF, use the **Search availability@City University** option. This will open the library catalogue bridge, where you can find out if the journal article is available in full text on another database.

- 5 **Narrow your results** – You can narrow by source type, subject, journal, author, and more by selecting the buttons on the left.


1. To print/email/save an individual article record, click on the journal article title, then use the options on the right hand screen to **print/email/save** or **export to Refworks** and follow the directions.

2. You can print, e-mail or save several records at once by saving them to a folder first. Click **Add to folder**.

3. To view the items in your folder, click **Folder** icon at the top of the main search screen.

4. You can also save all your results to your folder or **Save your search** from the Result List screen. Click on **Alert/Save/Share**.

5. To **save your results** or your search for future use, you need to **create and sign in** to your personal account (My EBSCOhost).


